Biographical Information

Bill Scheyer is the City Administrator for the City of Erlanger. He has served as President of the Northern Kentucky City and County Management Association (NKCCMA), was named the Outstanding City/County Administrator in 1993, and is Past President of the Kentucky City/County Management Association.

Mr. Scheyer has been active in numerous regional projects. He was instrumental in forming the 3-county Northern Kentucky Solid Waste District, and served as Chairman of the Technical Advisory Committee for that organization for 5 years. He also served as Chairman of the NKCCMA's Greenspace Committee in 1996, which released the first unified 3-county analysis of public greenspace needs in Northern Kentucky. He has served as Chairman of the Quest Regional Planning Forum. Mr. Scheyer also serves as President of the Board of Trustees for Green Umbrella: Regional Greenspace Alliance, which serves the entire Ohio-Kentucky-Indiana region.

In addition to his involvement in the government and environmental areas, Mr. Scheyer is a former chairman of the board of Northern Kentucky Family Health, now known as Health Point Family Care, a health care organization that provides primary medical care for low to moderate income residents of Northern Kentucky. He is also a member of the Cincinnati Association and serves as co-chair of that group's Regional Urban Core Action Team. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Creating Economic Opportunities, Inc., which is an organization seeking to increase economic opportunities for all minority groups throughout the region.

In 1999, Mr. Scheyer was the recipient of the Intergovernmental Unity of Effort Award given by the Northern Kentucky Area Development District to a person who is particularly instrumental in fostering collaborative efforts between diverse groups and jurisdictions. In 2003, he received the Innovator Award presented by the Greater Cincinnati Chapter of the American Society for Public Administration.

Prior to joining the City of Erlanger, Mr. Scheyer spent 20 years in the health care field. He concluded his health care career as an Assistant Vice-President for Materials Management at Bethesda Hospitals in Cincinnati, Ohio. He is the author of *THE HANDBOOK OF HEALTHCARE MATERIALS MANAGEMENT*, and was a contributing author for *THE HANDBOOK OF HEALTHCARE ADMINISTRATION*. Mr. Scheyer is a graduate of Northern Kentucky University, and an alumnus of both Leadership Northern Kentucky and the Greater Cincinnati Regional Leadership Forum. He has often served as a facilitator for public and strategic planning meetings.
