The Administrative Division of the Police Department encompasses several areas of the organization. They include the following: the Public Safety Communications Center with twelve dispatchers and an administrator, one School Resource Officer (SRO), one D.A.R.E. officer, several Police Clerks whose main responsibility is data entry, one officer who manages and maintains computer operations, a Lt. responsible for uniform and equipment purchasing, and administrators who maintain any other task for managing an office. These areas are managed by PSCC Manager Steve Castor and Captain Arens who also prepares and oversees budget expenses and Internal Affairs.

In this ever-changing business of law enforcement, the daily experiences of many police officers provide evidence that their role as law enforcers is changing rapidly and extensively. As we begin a new century of service we realize our duties will require personnel who are highly professional and prepared to continually raise their knowledge and skill levels. The Patrol Division of the Erlanger Police Department takes pride in delivering timely, courteous, professional service to the citizens of Erlanger. Our officers are among the best trained and most well equipped in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. All sworn officers are certified by the Commonwealth and are graduates of the Department of Criminal Justice Training Academy in Richmond, Kentucky. In addition, each officer is required to successfully complete a 14 week in-house Field Training Program before they are assigned to patrol duties. Officers must attend a minimum of 40 hours of annual training to maintain their certification; this training must be sanctioned by the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Additionally, each officer receives in-house training that includes firearms, first aid/CPR, QUAD, Baton and OC. Every patrol vehicle is equipped with the most modern technology; this includes Mobile Video/Audio for the collection and preservation of evidence and Mobile Data Computers to ensure fast and efficient flow of information.

One (1) Captain, two (2) Lieutenants, six (6) Sergeants and eighteen (18) Patrol Officers staff the Patrol Division. The officers within the division hold several specialized assignments, they include: Police Mountain Bike Patrol, K-9, Accident Reconstruction, ATV Patrol, Field Training and Firearms Instruction. Every shift is staffed with a Sergeant that serves as the supervisor and Lieutenants who are responsible for patrol operations.

Additionally, the duties of City Codes Enforcement are assigned to the Patrol Division.
